
Step back in time on the Treetop Walkway in Beelitz-Heilstätten

ONE OF A KIND

At a height of between 14 and 21 metres and more than 700 metres long, the Baum&Zeit treetop walkway not only towers above a varying and biodiverse natural environment. It also offers unique views of the splendid architecture in the historic tuberculosis sanatorium for women, which opened in 1902. As they stroll along the



walkway, visitors can learn about the trees below and the history of the sanatorium from the many bilingual (German and English) information boards. It is the only



For an extra thrill, climb through the "Skyboa" and the "Zitter-Gitter", then relax and unwind on the huge hammock.



The famous Beelitz Sanatoria were built more than 100 years ago. Today a unique treetop walkway (step-free access) winds its way back in time over the World War II ruins of the Alpine House. Working class people from the imperial capital of Berlin

once came here to recover from the then rampant tuberculosis, surrounded by the finest architecture in a spacious park and forest landscape. Exciting developments in the course of time and with them the many – very different – occupants and visitors left traces which can still be seen today. During your visit you will discover the unrivalled charm that these buildings give out – just like old castles.

In all four sections (quadrants) of the historic complex, their highly motivated

owners are busy filling the Beelitz Sanatoria with new life. The historic buildings are being revitalised and new ones built to provide both a healthcare centre and a residential area..







Here at "Baum&Zeit" we are preserving the buildings and the parklands that surround them and gradually bringing them back to life. Everything is being done with the greatest respect for the intentions and achievements of the architects and gardeners who once worked here and who devoted their skills to the work of the doctors and the well-being of the patients.

Our aim is to retain the character and atmosphere of the historic sanatorium and, with the treetop walkway, to offer our visitors the experience of observing it from a very special perspective.

The careful restoration of the buildings, with the exception of the Alpine House, began in 2020. Instead of being given a polished finish, the roofs, windows and doors are being painstakingly repaired in such a way that the history of the buildings remains visible and tangible, like the wrinkles in a 100-year-old face.

Our mission is to preserve the traces of the past for future generations to enjoy. We welcome you to join us on this mission.

THE FOREST PARK

Before even one of the buildings in the sanatoria was ready, the gardens were laid out for the patients to enjoy by Karl Koopmann, inspector at the Royal Gardens Academy. His aim was to provide an environment that was as



attractive and dust-free as possible, as the patients would spend long periods of time walking or resting in the fresh air – an important element of the therapy in Beelitz.

He planted sixty-five different varieties of trees and bushes, some of them exotic, as well as integrating many of the trees from the original pine forest into the park. A lot of plants, on the other hand, found their own way onto the "Alpine House" ruin, where they created our unique rooftop forest.

Our new walkway section is ready with surprising and exciting things to see and experience!

PARK RULES

- Dogs are not allowed.
- Please respect nature and do not pick or break any plants or leaves.
- Exploring the grounds is only allowed on the open paths.
- Breaking into buildings will be reported and prosecuted.
- Children under the age of 12 are only allowed to visit the treetop trail when accompanied by an adult.
- Children are not allowed to play in the forest areas.
 These are the nurseries of insects.
- Smoking is only allowed at the catering areas for fire safety reasons.
- Dispose of your cigarette butts and other litter in the rubbish bins provided.
- Photography is only permitted for private use.
- Flying with drones is prohibited.
- In extreme weather conditions (thunderstorms, storms, etc.) the adventure area will be closed.
- In the event of an evacuation, the staff must be followed.


In the old rest cure shelters and close to the park entrance, our partners from the "Alte Rösterei" serve speciality coffees from
